have been developed by the Thames Valley Violence Prevention Partnership and published via www.staytruetoyou.co.uk.

The workshop will explore how parents/carers can help build their child's confidence in their own abilities, overcome fear and build the trusted relationships needed so a young person knows there is always someone they can turn to for help. During the workshop you will develop understanding around:

- 1. The latest research conducted with young people from across the Thames Valley on their perceptions and how we can best communicate
- 2. The "Stay True to You" resources and approach with a focus on how to hold those difficult conversations
- Young people, brain development, behaviour and responses to stress
- 4. The importance of healthy, safe attachment for young people
- 5. The stages, signs and risk factors of exploitation
- 6. Gangs what they are, how they operate, and why?
- 7. External influences language, social media, gang-related music
- 8. Building resilience within the family and community
- 9. Further support available for families

The workshop, on 24th July at 6.30pm, is open to all parents, carers, family members and wider community members. You can book a space here.
