A leaflet is attached from Northampton Diocese explaining why they need your help to sustain Catholic Schools in the Diocese through voluntary parental contributions to their Schools Building Fund. At St Paul's we are currently raising funds for essential development and hope that the Schools Building Fund will support us with our Sixth Form building development. This will take the form of a new modular building to provide dedicated spaces to stimulate creativity and encourage success, as well as refurbishment of our current Sixth Form accommodation to future proof it for growth and maintain student wellbeing.

It is important that we support students to enable them to flourish and prepare them for higher education or the world of work. The planned Sixth Form development will allow us to provide a more professional learning environment with:

- Focused areas for quiet study and tasks requiring a high level of concentration
- Collaborative areas for networking and group discussions
- Dynamic spaces which provide flexibility for learning, independent study, pastoral activities and collective worship
- Breakout areas for relaxation and social interaction, with a focus on wellbeing and mental health

Please take a look at the leaflet and if you feel you are able to make a contribution (£15 per family per term is suggested) it would be appreciated but it is absolutely not compulsory. We have also provided an online bank standing order form here and a Gift Aid declaration form here for you to complete.

Finally if your child has a school locker can you please ask them to empty this out and return their key to the Finance Office before the end of term. During the summer holidays we will be tidying and carrying out maintenance on all our lockers which will include changing the locks on lockers where keys have not been returned. Please note that if your locker key has not been returned it will no longer work from September. If you would like your child to keep the same locker please ask them to let the Finance team know when they return their keys and we will reserve the key to be reissued to them in September when the annual payment has been received. A reminder that lockers cost £20 for one year and there is a £5 deposit for the key (which is refunded when the key is returned).
