

The Journey to success in the Sixth Form

PLAN AND REFLECT – Plan out your week and set yourself goals. Manage your time to meet deadlines. Reflect on your previous week, do you need to make changes?

READY TO LEARN - Arrive to school on time and have the essential equipment including a positive mindset.

THINK HARD AND WORK HARD - Take an active role in lessons, ask questions, challenge your peers. Make clear and useful notes students who engage in learning and think hard achieve well and progress. Thinking hard is one of our key priorities this year.

CONSOLIDATE YOUR LEARNING- Classwork and notes must be consolidated into flash cards or mind maps within 24 hours of the lesson.

INDEPENDENT LEARNING- For every hour spent in the classroom, you should spend at least the same amount of time on independent study. Undertake wider reading. Be proactive and seek help.






Attendance & punctuality

- Students are expected to attend all lessons including registration sessions on time.
- Failure to do so will result in access to leave school at lunchtime being denied.





Dress code

- Ensure that you adhere to the dress code when dressing for school.
- 1. Smart clothes that are school appropriate
- 2. Smart school appropriate footwear
- 3. Student Leader jumpers when students are representing the school or specific Departments.
- Ask if you're not sure.
- Violations of the dress code will result in the loss of access.



Mobile phones

- Mobile phones are a Sixth form privilege.
- No headphones/pods and mobiles to be worn and visible around the school except in the following places;

J block and S block study areas and the Sixth form social zone (outside K block).

- No phones/headphones/pods should be used during form time.
- All visible items will be confiscated.



Lunch

- Students can leave for lunch as soon as the bell rings if they have their ID cards and access.
- They should return before the end of lunch if they have lessons in the afternoon.
- No hot drinks to be brought on site.
- No hot food should be brought into school, all food should be consumed during lunch off the premises
- Use Wise pay to top up accounts if buying food from the food hut.

- InTouch sends emails directly to your inbox and SMS text messages directly to your mobile phone.
- Please ensure we have your correct email address to receive all important information regarding your child's sixth form studies.
- Class charts can be accessed to track your child's behaviour, view attendance to lessons, access their weekly timetable and view positive praise.
- You have now received your Year 12 parent code to access ClassCharts
